Programme Overview

With flexible focus areas, this degree is designed to develop critical thinking and analytical skills, preparing graduates for impactful careers in diverse fields.

Bachelor of Arts in Social Sciences

The Bachelor of Arts in Social Sciences is a multidisciplinary programme that equips students with essential knowledge in communication, economics, politics, society and culture, fostering a deep understanding of societal dynamics.

Students enrolled in the BA programme can choose from the following areas of focus:

Communication Studies

Communication Studies help you understand the role of human communication in development, from individual to institutional levels. This discipline enables you to analyze how communication processes impact the quality of life within a social system, shaping human freedom and empowering others.

Understanding communication theory allows you to influence system-based reforms in areas such as governance, peace and non-violent communication, agricultural extension, health communication, and political communication. The curriculum fosters a liberating impact on the mind.



Economics and Development Studies

Economics examines how societies, governments, businesses, households, and individuals allocate scarce resources. This discipline features the development of conceptual models to predict responses to policy and market changes, and the use of analytical models to investigate these changes. The study of economics provides knowledge of economic principles and exposes you to specialized branches of economic analysis, enhancing your understanding of development issues from an economic perspective. You will gain insights into critical economic events and become an informed participant in the modern economy.

Politics and International Relations Studies

Politics and International Relations Studies courses enable you to understand the complexities of national, global, and societal politics. This focus area provides conceptual exposure to the science and art of politics, helping you become an astute observer of societies, governments, and political systems worldwide. You will develop political thinking and critical reflection skills. Subjects include politics and governance, political ideologies, gender and politics, cyber politics, politics under globalization, international political economy, conflict, war and peace, political violence, security, world politics, and political theory. This focus is ideal for those interested in studying political processes, institutions, global politics, and politics at the government and societal levels.

Society and Culture Studies

Drawing from Sociology and Social Anthropology, Society and Culture Studies offer a broad range of topics on social institutions and cultural processes. This discipline equips you with the concepts, knowledge, and skills to understand and analyze social issues. Topics include globalization, marriage and family, education, political systems, social movements, religious institutions, identity, social psychology, gender, and development. This area of study is particularly useful for those curious about people, society, and culture, and for those planning a people-oriented career.



Gold Medals

Students who perform well in the BA in Social Sciences are eligible for the following Gold Medals at the end of the programme. These are awarded annually at the University Convocation.

- Dr. Gamani Corea Gold Medal to the Best Student in Social Sciences
- Dr. Anura Goonesekera Gold Medal to the Best Student in Mass Communication
- Professor H. A. de. S. Gunasekera Gold Medal to the Best Student in Economics
- Professor Gananath Obeysekere Gold Medal to the Best Student in Sociology

Course Selection

You must select your area of focus at the time of registration. The detailed curriculum is provided in the prospectus. Please review it carefully to choose your focus area.

Making changes to registered courses

After registration you have a specified period to make changes to your registered courses, during which you can add or drop courses by completing a form available from the Assistant Registrar of the Faculty. You can also contact the Department Coordinator or the Regional Director in your area. You must maintain a maximum of 36 credits and a minimum of 9 credits. No changes are allowed after the designated period.

Programme Structure

The BA programme starts at Level 3 and requires a minimum of 3 years to complete. Each academic year is divided into two semesters, with a maximum of 15 credits per semester. A total of 90 credits is needed to complete the programme. Each year, a combination of compulsory and elective courses is offered, along with Continuing Education (CE) courses, which can include up to 10 credits annually. Some CE courses, such as English are compulsory.
